ENRICHMENT activities are extremely important to us at Noadswood and are part of everyday life at school. Our aim is to guide pupils through their school career and allow them to learn vital life-skills along the way. They will be encouraged to explore new and exciting activities and to identify for themselves where their individual talents and passions lie. Your child will be given endless opportunities to develop new skills and it is a true strength of Noadswood that we have a body of staff who value extra-curricular activities and support pupils in participating fully in school-life.

CITIZENSHIP education runs through all five years of school. Our ultimate goal is to see each and every pupil graduate as a fully rounded individual, ready to face the challenges that lie ahead. We give pupils the skills to make their own decisions and take responsibility for their own lives and communities. Pupils explore questions about democracy, justice and inequality and they learn to work together to create solutions that try to address challenges facing neighbourhoods and wider communities as well as developing political literacy to make a positive contribution to society.

LEADERSHIP skills are developed from a young age. We appoint pupil leaders who not only take responsibility for helping with resources but also work as coaches and mentors to younger pupils. These pupils often visit our feeder schools to deliver lessons such as French and History to primary school pupils. Within each House pupils are elected as House Captains and as representatives for elements such as media and sport. The House Captains run a student council called 'Student Voice' which comprises pupil representatives from every tutor group. Opinions and comments are welcomed from this group and it is a forum to take ideas from pupils in all school matters from the canteen food to the school uniform policy.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES are a real strength of Noadswood School. In addition to our popular and extremely successful sports clubs we have everything from a model aeroplane club to rock bands to a creative writing group and even a juggling club. Our Duke of Edinburgh scheme is particularly popular with the older pupils and the Christmas Revue is a popular showcase of the talents of pupils. We also have an annual production of a play or musical and the annual Sports day is a highlight with activities such as a slip and slide, space-hopper racing and 'dunk the teacher'. On a weekly basis there is something exciting happening in school such as a County cooking competition, a visit from a class of French students, a charity bake-sale or a poetry workshop.
