The Noadswood School class of 2019 will be feeling extremely proud of themselves as they collect their results today! The school is equally proud of them all, and is delighted to report a particularly strong set of outcomes, including in the Basics (English and Maths), with 73.4% of pupils gaining a grade 4 or above and 53.2% gaining a grade 5 or above, figures that are around 10% higher than last year. A superb 15% of pupils smashed the Basics at grade 7 or above.

Over 81% of youngsters gained a grade 4 or above in English, and 79% did so in Maths, embedding real excellence in the quality of both teaching and learning in these subjects in the now established more rigorous curriculum at Key Stage 4. Noadswood's scientists also performed brilliantly in the Separate Sciences, with over 80% gaining a grade 7 or above in Physics, 75% attaining these grades in Chemistry and 65% in Biology.

The pupils continue to thrive in the rich curriculum at Noadswood, too, evidenced by excellent attainment in PE, Music, French, German and Food Preparation and Nutrition to name just some of the other subjects studied by this talented and enthusiastic year group.
