*Government definition of 'close contact' as of Friday 11th September 2020:

- Direct close contacts – face to face contact with a case for any length of time, within 1 metre, including being coughed on, face to face conversation or unprotected physical contact (skin to skin)

- Proximity contacts – extended close contact (within 1 to 2 metres for more than 15 minutes) with an infected individual

- Travelling in a small vehicle, like a car, with an infected person

NB The school will liaise with you re the provision of work if your child is at home self-isolating, but well. We will pass on the fact this is the case to the relevant House Leaders – please contact their House Leaders or <u>health@noadswood.hants.sch.uk</u> with respect to this should you have questions.
