Tom's been busy doing some super professional whittling work with wood:










I like the look of that planetarium a lot, and I also love this art work by James – that guy has a cheeky look in his eye, and such a warm smile!




Finlay was busy with his very yummy D and T design work, amongst lots of other good stuff:
