Just like every platform – from global organisations such as Microsoft to supermarkets to our own Frog portal – things are creaking sometimes, but there is no pressure on your child to complete work at a particular time. We want them to know they do not need to worry.

If your child is reluctant to engage, or is tricky with you about getting underway with work, please let someone know. Tutors, House Leaders, ELSAs, LSAs, Leadership Team members, in fact, most of us, are checking in with lots of young people regularly and we're happy to add your child to the list so you are not dealing with anything school related by yourselves.
