Exam techniques that help in most exams

- Highlight as you read – command words, key words, additional instructions (you should include in your answer...)
- Check the number of marks
- Reread ALL the paper if they finish.
- Fill in all answers with best guess.
- Don't leave ANY blanks.

Exam Regulations

- Ensure that you have checked your timetable.
- No phones or watches – they **MUST** be switched off and in your bag.
- Exam conditions at all times from entry to exit.
- Make sure you have all of the correct equipment black pens, calculators, clear bottles, pencil cases
- Be outside of the Exam venue 10-15 mins before
- If you are ill and unable to sit the exam contact the school immediately and we can then advise of the next steps.

A. Regulations – Make sure you understand the rules

1. Be on time for all your exams. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
2. Do not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
3. If you try to cheat, or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from all your subjects.
4. You must not take into the exam room: notes; an iPod, a mobile phone, a MP3/4 player or similar device, or a watch. Any pencil cases taken into the exam room must be see-through.

Remember: possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.

5. If you have a watch, the invigilator will ask you to hand it to them.
6. Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
7. Do not talk to or try to communicate with, or disturb other candidates once the exam has started.
8. You must not write inappropriate, obscene or offensive material.
9. If you leave the exam room unaccompanied by an invigilator before the exam has finished, you will not be allowed to return.
10. Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.

Information for candidates

Written examinations

With effect from 1 September 2021

Study Leave

- Study leave begins **Monday 6th June 2022** – normal school until this date and then on this date **you only need to come in for lessons which still have an exam to be completed** (though you are expected to come in)
- Computer Science / Music / Child Development / Travel and Tourism / Drama are taken then their final exam is before ½ term – so you do not need to come to these lessons any more
- English has a final exam on 10th June 2022 – so you are expected to keep going to your English lessons until this date
- The last exam is Physics, so you'll be expected to attend all Physics lessons up until Leavers Day

Signing In / Out

- It is **CRUCIAL that everyone signs in when you come onto site and signs out when you leave** for health and safety – this is not something you can forget to do. If, as a year group, you're not doing it well then we'll be forced to stop the study leave in this way. The responsibility is on you all to get this right!
- Tutor time will not be taking place after $\frac{1}{2}$ term – instead **whenever you come onto site or want to leave you need to go to reception** (via the science entry) and **sign in or out** *and you need to do this multiple times if you're coming in and out more than once*
- E.g. arrive at 8.55am for lesson 1 – sign in. You leave after lesson 1, so sign out at 10.00am. You might come back for lesson 5, so sign back in at 13.45pm. The only exception is you do not need to sign out after lesson 5

Signing In / Out

- You need to enter / leave by the **main gate** and it is important that you **plan your arrival time** – you need to come onto site around 5 minutes before your lesson starts (so as to not disturb the rest of the school). You'll need to plan this and be organised!
- School **uniform expectations remain** – if you're on site for lessons or for exams, you're in uniform

Signing In / Out

- Consider our neighbours – if **you're signing out, you need to be going straight home or to where you're revising** – not to the shops as large groups / the park etc... Again, the responsibility is on your all as a collective
- If you're unable to go home between lessons, we'll have a dedicated room for you to study in – we'll confirm this room a little closer to the time
