

PSA News:

In our most recent AGM, the PSA were delighted to welcome two new members- Mrs Western and a parent member- Mrs Steele. We were also excited to fund the following things for our students:

Year 11 Prom Donation: We were delighted to donate £500 towards Prom. This, in conjunction with the 'Wear Something Different' proceeds, will be used to lower the cost of the prom ticket and to fund all of the wonderful extras that make that night so special.

Bike Compound: We are delighted to support the fundraising of our students by donating £500 towards their fundraising for a new Bike Shelter. We will be also supporting their fundraising efforts throughout the year.

Year 10 Geography Enrichment: The PSA has funded a Guest Speaker to enrich the 'Economic World' unit at GCSE. The speaker is a former employee of ESSO, and he will be delivering a tailored STEM lecture for our students to help develop their knowledge and understanding of how the oil refinery works and its environmental impact.

Year 10 and 11 History Enrichment: The PSA was delighted to fund the visit of an author, Adele Jordan, to come to school to teach our Year 10 and Year 11 pupils about the processes of historical



research and how to become a successful author. This will enrich their understanding of where History can take them should they choose to follow this further!

Year 10 and 11 Photography: The Art department will use their donation to continue to add and enhance photographic equipment in this growing subject area. This will include additional DSLR cameras, new lighting and give them the opportunity to expand the types of creative work that can be produced by those who opt for the GCSE.

Football kits for both boys and girls football teams and netball dresses: The PE department will use their donation to purchase new football kits and Netball dresses. Mr Shearsmith says that some of our football kits have been at Noadswood longer than he has and some of you may appreciate how long that is!! With our current uplift in Netball, the PE department felt it was really important to invest in some new netball dresses. Bibs over the top of our PE kit is not the image that reflects the standard and status of Netball here at Noadswood so the PSA's investment will really showcase our improving netball standard.

Bags2School:

On Monday 20th November we will have a Bags2schools collection. You can drop bags from 2.50 on Friday 17th November and before 9.00 am on Monday 20th November. Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.


As well as raising vitally needed funds for our PSA, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However, it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year. By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys. In addition to raising much needed funds, it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse. Don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

Department News:

Geography Enrichment:

On Thursday 9th November a group of year 9 students were invited to visit the Ordnance Survey in Southampton for a GIS (Geographical information Systems) workshop. During the afternoon the students were given the opportunity to see how various data is presented on digital maps and how this is used in a variety of ways from deciding the location of housing developments to providing information for emergency planning. The students were then given the chance to use the 'gridpoint gb' app to explore the grounds and collect data. They were then shown how this data could be



presented in Excel and imported into Digi maps, which is the digital version of OS maps. The students also played a game of Pictionary to refresh their knowledge of OS map symbols. I would like to thank all students for their excellent behaviour and engaging in all the activities. They were particularly great at answering plenty of questions and earning themselves an OS pen.

UK Parliament Week 2023

Last week saw us mark UK Parliament Week 2023 which is a dedicated week in the calendar of Citizenship in where we teach our students about all things 'Political' & help them to develop their knowledge of the UK Parliament.
