Pastoral News – Year Nine

I would like to start by congratulating the vast majority of year nines on their return to school after summer. Year nine can be a difficult year, but I have noted that so many have grown and matured and have grasped this new year with a positive attitude. Many have grown so much taller too!

The year group feels calmer and more focused. I have very much enjoyed visiting year nine lessons when I can. The lessons I have dropped in on have been so purposeful. Whilst I recognise the difficulties that some individuals can present, on the whole, I see students engaged, working well and responding positively to teaching on a daily basis. This is a credit to the efforts our students are making, including the number of those actively taking part in clubs, teams and events, which makes me very proud.

I often speak to the year group about reputation and opportunities and it is wonderful to be able to share news of those who have embraced this. We have welcomed 39 new Junior Prefects this term. This wonderful group have taken the opportunity to step up and take on additional responsibilities in school; this includes leading tours of the school to external visitors and supporting other pupils. Soon, they'll begin visiting year seven tutor groups to work with younger members of the Noadswood community. Year nine have had sporting success in and out of school. The boys' football team ended the season on a high, winning their final match against Burgate 3-2, with a couple of spectacular goals and a battling team performance. This grit and determination were mirrored by the girls' under 14 Netball team, some of whom experienced a tough challenge, competing for the first time at the Hampshire Schools tournament at Southampton Sports Centre just before half-term. To quote Miss King "They played brilliantly against some really strong schools. This was absolutely the stretch and challenge that these girls need in their netball! They have represented the school fantastically".

Continuing the theme of sporting success, Alex from 9D1 represented Noadswood at the ESSA (English Schools Swimming Association) South East Division Trials in Guildford in diving. The trials consisted of six dives, these varied in degrees of difficulty from the 3m springboard. He came third in his category and secured a place in the National Schools Final in Manchester in December, where he will represent Noadswood again!



I am delighted that Rebecca from 9A1 returned from Sheffield with her first National League medal. She won this for the Double Mini Trampoline and came second out of 23 finalists. This is just a small example of the outstanding accomplishments at national, county and school level, which fills me with pride.

All in all, the last half-term has been a really successful start to the year. Well done year nine. Here's to another positive half-term!

As part of our Open Mornings and Evening, our prefects have been busy taking prospective year six parents on tours of the Noadswood site. The feedback has been incredibly positive and, in recognition of their hard work, they were treated to Dominoes Pizza and an extended lunch break just before the end of the half-term.

In addition to the tours, our Head Student Team, along with Miss Marshall, have been out visiting our local primary and junior schools, in order to share what they can expect when they join us next year.

The extra-curricular programme started swiftly with the year eleven football team taking part in weekly fixtures and training. The number of pupils attending training has been incredible, with some weeks having 30 players attend. There has been some success on the pitch too, with a good victory in the Hampshire Cup and an upcoming trip to Bay House in Gosport in the next round.

The U16 girls' netball team have also been playing regularly, with Miss King commenting on the improvements the players have shown over the weeks, so well done girls.



The rugby and basketball teams have also begun their training sessions for the upcoming season. There are lots of tough fixtures ahead in the rugby County Cup and Southampton District League for basketball. The teams will continue to have weekly training ,so make sure you come along if you'd like to the opportunity to join the teams.

As we move towards the second half of the term, the focus shifts to the mock examinations. These exams are a great opportunity for pupils to gauge their current attainment and to see what areas they need to focus on in the new year. We are aware that for some this can be a stressful time, so we plan to offer some workshops to support our students and tackle any stress surrounding exams. Subject News

PE:

The first half term has been nothing short of outstanding. Our levels of engagement have been at its highest level for many years and by asking students to sign in via the QR code, we know that, at the time of writing, we are nearing 1500 sign ins to after school clubs, most of which are PE clubs.

Our boys training and fixtures continue to be hugely successful within the local schools' league and we have expanded to the Hampshire Cup football and rugby for our year eleven teams. We hope this will increase the amount of fixtures we play against appropriately challenging opponents.

Despite all the positivity above, it's the success of the girls that I'd like to focus on. They have blown us away with their success and engagement, we couldn't be more pleased or proud.



Our new focus on girls' football has got off to a flying start. Our year nine and ten teams visited Testwood School for a tournament and were both deservedly crowned champions!



In addition to this, on the most thundery night of the year, our year seven and eight teams also visited Testwood School and were set to win the competition, until the weather forced an early conclusion and everyone ran for cover!

Our badminton club has been so popular that we have had discussions about splitting it by key stage. Hopefully, this will reduce the number attending each session, so the player experience is better.

With the mock exam window on the horizon and the need to move Mrs Burnston onto some netball fixtures, we conclude this half term's netball with incredibly high numbers and a third place in the under 14 New Forest Tournament.



Netball has been a huge focus for PE so far this year and we have seen a huge uplift in engagement and ability throughout the squads. The year seven and eights have two teams in the league and competition for places has been hotting up! This is magnificent; the girls are really pushing each other to the next level and we are steering them to Dreams Netball Club (near David Lloyd) to increase their exposure to a high level club environment.

After an early start one the 12th October, the year elevens set off to the Tower of London.



The students were excellent on this trip; they were inquisitive and interested at all the sights of the Norman White Tower in the centre, as well as the famed Traitor's Gate where four queens of England had made their way into the tower, their fates sealed.

The main attraction and real star of the show was of course the Crown Jewels. The students were starstruck to be in the presence of such a

precious collection. One even asked, "How much do you think this is all worth?" as we walked through the two-foot-thick steel vault doors.

Many of the students were able to appreciate the tower through their Elizabethan England knowledge from GCSE, drawing links to the riches captured by Sir Francis Drake on his 1577





Circumnavigation of the Globe, Sir Walter Raleigh's cell, and even parts of the Elizabethan armoury, extending their knowledge further on the topic!




Overall, the students enjoyed their trip up to London. What a wonderful day out and well done year eleven.

Computer Science:

It has been fantastic to welcome the new computer scientists to the KS4 course – they've taken to the subject unbelievable quickly, having learnt the basics of Python. We've already started looking at iteration and operators alongside the fundamentals of computing and data representation. Well done everyone!

Year eleven have also returned well – we're looking to replicate the last couple of years' excellent GCSE results, so students are preparing for their two mock papers. We're proud of the dedicated FROG site which has access to everything the students need, as well as the number of students completing their independent learning to assist in this preparation.





Year Eight Geography Trip to London

Annual Eco Conference, Winchester College



English:


Year 7 Book Buzz!

Design & Technology:

In Design & Technology we have continued to run our Model Kit Club this school year.

We have students from year seven to eleven taking part and have started the year by producing some really detailed and interesting models. The students have begun to develop skills such as airbrushing and weathering, which can be seen from the Heinkel He111 model here.

Model Club takes place on Thursday afternoons between 3 and 4pm and is open to all students. Kits can be supplied or students can bring their own to work on.
